



- L AUDIO R Connects these terminals to analog audio inputs of a TV set. Or connect these terminals to the L/R inputs of a separate audio component.

3. Remote Control Unit

- STOP: Press to stop playback or recording
- MENU: Press to display the Main Menu on the screen
- EXIT: Press to return to the previous menu
- ▲/▼/CH+/-: Move cursor up/down: Channel + / -

- OK: Confirm
 - (LIST)Press to display all TV channels or all Radio channels

- FAV: Press to display the favorite channel's list for setting

- Press to input a dash in a virtual channel number
- CC: Press to turn on/off closed captioning

- PLAY: Press to resume playback
- PAUSE: Press to pause playback or recording
- RECALL: Press to switch between current & last TV channel
- HOLD: This is a Control Key under USB/Video and PVR mode
- REPEAT: Press this button to repeat the current options
- USB: Press to view content of connected external HDD or Flash drive
- TIMER: Press to go to Programmed Time Recording setup
- AUDIO: Switch Audio channel
- PVR LIST: Personal video recording list

INFO. key

Press "INFO" key to display the Information banner while viewing TV programs. Information banner:



AUDIO key

Some programs may have multilingual audio language and this audio broadcast may be on a different audio mode such as Stereo, Left or Right. All the available audio languages will be displayed on the audio track window when you press the L/R key. The screenshot illustrates this below. If there is no audio output after you have selected the audio language, it indicates that there is no audio on the current audio mode, so you have to select the previous audio mode.



CC key

Certain programs have multilingual subtitle information. All available subtitle languages will be displayed in the subtitle information window when you press the **CC** key. The screenshot illustrates this below. Follow the help information in the subtitle window to select preferred subtitle.



◄ 4 ♦ ▶ (PREV / NEXT) key **4 ♦ ▶ I** (F.R. / F.F) key

The PREV/NEXT key and F.R./F.F. key can be used during playback of multimedia programs from your external USB device. Press the PREV/NEXT key to go to the previous/next program and F.R./F.F. key to fast forward or rewind during playback.

EPG key

Press EPG key to display the on screen electronic program guide.

This displays a 7 days Electronic Program Guide for all programs being broadcast from all available broadcasters.



OK/(LIST) key

Press OK key to display all TV channels or all Radio channels. Follow the help information at the bottom of the window to select preferred channel.



FAV key

Setting up Favorite TV or Radio Channels:

You can add preferred channels to a favourite's channel list. Press the Menu key to access the Program Edit Menu. The Favourite channel option allows you to classify the channels by different genre: Movies/News/Sports/Music. Press the "FAV" or "OK" key to confirm your selection. A heart shaped symbol will appear next to that channel which confirms your selection.




Disable Favourite TV or Radio Channel:

Press the Menu key to access the Program Edit Menu. The list of the favourite channels will be displayed. Highlight the desired channel to be disabled. Press "FAV" button, select the "Disable" option and press the "FAV" or OK" key to cancel. Press the "Exit" key to exit the menu.

Cable Connections

Make sure the STB is connected properly as below:



Press MENU key to display the main menu. It consists of 7 items as following:

- · Program
- Picture
- · Channel Search
- · Time Setting
- Option
- System
- · USB

Note: In any page of the menu, you can use EXIT key to return to previous menu page, or press MENU key switch to Main Menu page and then press MENU key again to exit Main Menu.



RF Output

The system can output channel 3 or channel 4 NTSC RF signal as following:



- Use a cable to connect "RF OUT" converter of the STB and your TV can support CATV input.
- 2. Auto search the program and change current channel to CH3 or CH4 directly by inputting the channel number in your TV.

Loop through output setting

The system can select the loop through as following:

- 1. Use a cable to connect "RF OUT" converter of the STB and your TV can support CATV input
- 2. Go to the Setup Menu and ON/OFF the loop through RF output
- 3. Auto search the program to the target channels. (when searching programs, please use TV Remote) Note: When under the setting of LOOP THROUGH, the machine will not play the TV program.

Time Setting

Time Zone: select Time and Timezone.

Sleep: press ▶ key to select the Sleep Time (1~12hours).

Power ON/OFF: press ▶ key into the setting menu, select Power ON Time or Power OFF Time.

Music: You can choose your favorite songs, fast forward & fast rewind, stop and play, go to, REPEAT.

Photo: After choose the specific picture from the preview file, you can press the "Enter" key for the full screen. And press "Play" key enter the slide show mode; if you want the slide show go with music, you need to play the music first and then open the picture, then you will go with slide show + music.

Movie: You can choose any movie or song as you like, change last and next, fast forward & fast rewind, play and stop, goto, REPEAT and so on. Press the "PLAY" key enter the full screen status.

PVR: Depends on user's choose, there are some functions like remove/edit/delete and so on. Play/stop/last/next/fast forward/fast rewind/repeat all these functions can be done with the remote, just according to what the user's request. If you press the remote's "HOLD" key, you will enter the "Full Screen" status.

PVR Function

The PVR function allows you to record and replay your favorite programs.

There are two ways to record your TV programs: Instant Recording and Timer Schedule recording.

Before you record a program, you will need to connect an USB flash drive or external hard drive to the converter box first. The maximum capacity of HDD you can connect is up to 2TB. (USB flash drive and external hard drive are sold separately)

Please note that due to buffer speed requirement some USB flash drive may not compatible when used with the Timer function.

1. Instant Recording

Press the **REC** key to start recording the current TV program that you are watching. The recording clock should be displayed on the top left hand side of the screen. Press **info** key to view information of the recording. Press **STOP** key to stop the current recording.

2. Timer Schedule Recording

You will not miss any of your favorite programs with the Timer Schedule Recording feature.

Option 1: On TV mode, press **EPG key** to open the Electronics Program Guide, select the channels and program you wish to record. Press **OK key** to confirm the selection. A schedule Event window will appear on the screen. Select and set the correct parameters to schedule the recording. **Set the mode option to record**. This program will be automatically recorded at the schedule time.

Option 2: Press the **Timer key** on the remote to enter the schedule Event Menu and press number **1 key** to add a recording schedule.

You can edit the set timer recording in the schedule Event Menu by press the number 2 key. Then edit the channel number, name date, start time and end time. Select the option of Once, Daily, Week recording as desire.

If you need to delete a schedule recording, you can press the number **3 key** in the schedule Event Menu.

Play your recorded programs (USB Key Function)

You can play the program that you record by pressing the **USB key** on the remote. Make sure you connect the USB Flash drive or Hard Drive to the converter box first.

- 1. Select PVR in the menu, you will see the window open for the USB drive that you connect.
- 2. Go to **folder HBPVR** and press OK, you will see the list of video that you recorded.
- 3. Select the video that want to play and press OK. You will see the small preview window on the right hand side.
- 4. Press Hold Key to change to full screen.
- 5. Press STOP, PAUSE or EXIT if you don't want to stop, pause or guit the video.
